Dance & Movement

Dawn States - Adaptive Dance and Movement

Transforming and Transposing Dance

Program Description: These classes cover the basic concepts of dancing as well as implementing some ballet movement and vocabulary for structure. Each class features a check-in, a warm-up, creative movement exercises such as choreography and explorative movement and a cool-down followed by a check-in. This workshop is designed so that participants leave with a basic understanding of movement vocabulary, elements to dance and more bodily awareness. It is also designed to leave room for participants to transpose and access movement in a way that feels safe and supportive of them and fosters their self-expression as participants in the arts.

Dance Lab

Instrument Making Session

Program Description: Travel around the world in song, and create a wonderful working version of one world music instrument such as a shekere, guiro, ocean drum, monkey drum, rainstick, turtle rattle, Australian clapsticks (bilma) or didgeridoo. This workshop includes background on the instrument, creating the DIY instrument and playing it along with live music. What a wonderful way to explore world cultures!

Jazzin' it up with the Harp with Gloria Galante

Program Description: Gloria helps students discover the joy and beauty of music as they listen to the variety of wonderful sounds of the harp and are introduced to the history of this unique instrument. The harp is one of the most ancient of the stringed instruments. Remains of harps have been found in Egyptian tombs that are 6000 years old. The harp's beautiful sound and aesthetic triangular shape have captured people's imaginations for many centuries, and even today, the fascination lives on. Harp music has experienced resurgence in popularity in recent years. Reflecting this, harps are now regularly part of ensembles in traditions as widely varied as folk, early music, Renaissance, popular and jazz, as well as world and fusion styles.

Bucket Drumming with Leon Jordan

Program Description: Drummer Leon Jordan explores one of the most intuitive forms of music making: percussion. Spanning genres including jazz, Caribbean, traditional classical, and current pop, this highly interactive program presents many types of rhythms, techniques, percussion instruments, as well as historical and cultural contexts. This program gets audiences out of their seats and out of their comfort zones, and into the expansive and inspiring experience of bucket drumming and playing percussion.

World Drum Workshop

Program Description: Tony brings audiences an interactive show highlighting the many styles of drums and rhythms from around the globe. Participants will be given a brief history on how certain drums are made, their original purpose and reason for being created, and where the drums have migrated to in our musical world today. After each drum is demonstrated, a volunteer will play with the group while the rest of the participants will be lead to clap new rhythms, using dynamics and accents. The goal of these sessions is to make sure that everyone works together to create a percussion jam session that eventually winds down into quiet rhythms that fades to silence. A question and answer session is conducted at the end of each session.

Program Description: Laugh Out Loud 4 Real is a gentle form of Hasyayoga, a practice involving voluntary laughter with deep breathing. Participants can sit in chairs or stand. No floor work is required. Laughter Yoga is based on the belief that voluntary laughter provides the same physiological and psychological benefits as spontaneous laughter. Laughter yoga is done in groups, with eye contact, movements, music, singing, and playfulness between participants without jokes or comedy. It is a great exercise to relieve stress for elementary school children up to seniors.

Suminagashi: Japanese Paper Marbling

Participants will learn the history behind the practice, watch a demonstration, and then make and print their own designs. Marbled paper can be folded to make cards. Even mistakes and challenges in dexterity produce gorgeous results in Suminagashi!

The Clay Studio - Clay Mobile

The Claymobile One Day Workshop

Program Description: Claymobile sends a teaching artist and an assistant directly to a host site, bringing all of the supplies and materials necessary to conduct a ceramic art lesson. The teaching artist and assistant lead students through comprehensive lessons catered to age, ability, and classroom goals that teach students the basics of building with clay and focus on stimulating the creative imagination. Work is constructed at the site and then transported back to the Claymobile's studio for firing. The final art works will be delivered back to the site in 4 weeks. For virtual workshops, supply kits with air-dry clay are available to be mailed to clients ahead of time. **This workshop is available as an in-person or virtual experience.**
